Construction of the new County Courthouse is in its final months, with the facility scheduled to be opened in January 2017. Located to the north and east of the Vaughan-Bradley Sheriff's Office Building, the new courthouse will hold six modern courtrooms with current security and technology. In addition to the judges, the space will house the Commonwealth's Attorney, Clerk of the Circuit Court and other related court offices. The County's current courthouses (not the historic Courthouse on Rt. 301) were built nearly 40 years ago and the space shortage which had been an issue for years was intensified when Hanover gained two additional courts in July 2013. The current Circuit Court and District Court buildings will be converted to offices for other County departments.

All-Stars recognized by the Board

The past few months have been such a roller coaster of emotion for me. The mass shootings we've had are a tough situation and sometimes watching the national news is a real downer. But then I have the opportunity to see our young people here in Hanover County and that roller coaster goes back up.

Attending the graduations of our high school students in June and hearing them talk about God and country give me real optimism about the future of our nation. I also get to meet with a number of young people at the various ceremonies the Board has and they make me very proud.

Many of our young people choose to serve our community through projects they accomplish through the boy scouts and girl scouts. We have what seems like must be a record number of Eagle Scouts in Hanover County and I think I can speak for all of the Board when I say that I am

privileged to be able to recognize their accomplishments.

Another thing that makes me very proud is the success our young people have had in athletic arenas. Just in the last few months, for example, the Hanover High School baseball team won their third state title in four years and the Atlee High softball team won their second straight state championship.

I also was very proud recently when the Board recognized Katie Anderson, who graduated from Randolph-Macon College in May. Katie was one of the greatest basketball players in Patrick Henry history and graduated from R-MC as the top rebounder in the history of the Yellow Jackets' women's basketball program.

And here comes the next generation. In May the Board recognized the 2015 Atlee Little League All Star Major Softball Team (pictured above), which won the Virginia State Little League Championship.

So I think the future is bright with our young people here in Hanover County and I am going to remember that through the ups and downs of our national news.

Major road projects underway; Atlee Rd extension to start soon

Construction on two significant Hanover road projects scheduled to be completed in September, with an even larger project about to get underway.

Additional turn lanes at the **intersection of Atlee Road and U.S. Rt. 301** are required by contract to be completed by September 16. This project also includes modifying the entrance to the Patriots Corner Shopping Center and drainage improvements along Atlee Road.

Also currently underway are improvements to the **intersection of Pole Green and Walnut Grove** roads. These improvements will include adding a right turn lane on northbound Walnut Grove Road and a left turn lane on westbound Pole Green Road. By contract, work must be completed by September 7.

Atlee-area residents and commuters will witness the beginning of a major multi-year road project in early 2017.

A new road will be constructed to connect **Atlee Road in Rutland to Atlee Station Road near Warren Avenue**. This project will involve the construction of a bridge over the CSX rail line at Cool Spring Road and will also create new intersections at Cool Spring Road and Atlee Station Road.

Construction of Atlee Road Extension is estimated to take about 24 months to complete.

underway on **U.S. Rt. 360**. Additional lanes are being added to Rt. 360 between the I-295 interchange and Wynbrook Lane and the intersection of Bell Creek Road South and Rt. 360 is being re-located about 650 feet to the east to align with Bell Creek Road North.

It's a global economy now, and that applies to Hanover County as well.

International companies are increasing their investments in our local

economy, expanding their operations and creating jobs.

For example, did you know that the largest manufacturer of decorative confectionery industry in Latin America now has its U.S. headquarters in Hanover County?

Mavalério, a Brazil-based manufacturer of confections for the baking industry, invested \$5 million in a new production facility and U.S. headquarters in Northlake Business Park last year. Mavalério makes sugary products like chocolates, sprinkles and other sweet toppings.

This spring, Porvair Filtration Group, a manufacturer of high-technology filtration systems, moved into a 55,000-square-foot facility in Ashland. Porvair Filtration Group is an international leader in their field, manufacturing in the United Kingdom

as well as the United States.

Hanover also is the location of the two Morooka Truck Carriers manufacturing facilities in the U.S. The two production plants in Hanover County – Morooka America, LLC and its sister company, Virginia Steel Specialties, LLC – make machines valued at more than \$15 million annually.

Companies are attracted to Hanover for many reasons, including a talented labor pool, low taxes, good infrastructure and strategic location. Their employees are attracted to our quality of life and see this as a great place to raise their children.

"In 1998, we started with one company and five employees," said Ken Byrd, president of Morooka USA, when the second production plant opened on U.S. Rt. 1. "Today, we have five companies, and we now have 53 employees."

"Hanover has an excellent reputation for being a business-friendly county," Mr. Byrd said, and we have worked hard at that for many years.

It's good to see that we are now being recognized for that quality – all over the world.

A national award

Initiative creates business opportunities

Hanover County has won a national award for a program intended to bolster economic development.

Called the “Strategic Zoning Initiative”, the program creates a win-win situation for property owners who own large tracts within the suburban services area that are particularly well suited for business purposes.

If their land is designated for agricultural, forestry, and open space purposes – and therefore assessed at a lower rate – the owners can now ask the Board to zone their property for certain economic development uses while continuing to be taxed at the lower rate.

It’s a simple and innovative concept.

Property owners can defer the costs associated with performing various studies until the property is developed, and the County can market the property for business growth.

Two property owners last year successfully completed the zoning process using this Initiative.

The first parcel, identified as the “Baldwin Tract”, contains nearly 96 acres located adjacent to I-95.

The second property identified as the “Holland Tract” contains 118 acres at the intersection of Cedar Lane and Route 1.

Both cases were subject to public hearings in which input from citizens was sought and received. Conditions

include appropriate buffering and screening as well as standards for master planning, architectural controls and landscaping requirements.

The Strategic Zoning Initiative was recognized by the National Association of Counties with a 2016 Achievement Award.

In the application which won the NACo Achievement Award, Planning Director David P. Maloney noted that “the properties zoned under this process will create long term tax benefits to county residents through increased employment opportunities, increased real estate assessments, sales tax, personal property tax, machinery and tools tax, and merchants’ capital tax.”

Hanover’s next generation of Fire/EMS providers



Through its partnerships with Reynolds Community College and Hanover County Public Schools, Hanover Fire/EMS offers a Firefighter/EMT program for high school students. Graduates of the program earn college credit and their registration fees and books for related classes at RCC are paid for by Hanover Fire/EMS. Of the 29 students who graduated from these classes on June 13, nearly half have already joined stations in Hanover or are in the process of joining. The only requirement to serve as an Officer of Elections is to be a registered voter in Virginia. You can choose to serve as a volunteer or as a paid officer.






